I babysat for your parents Lillian and Harold when I was in high school, Debbie was just a toddler. She was the pride of your parents, the only child at the time.
I had written a note when your parents passed away also. My first job at sixteen was at Harold's Souvenir Shop when it was located on Wyandotte Street. It was fun but your mother was a better salesperson so I took on babysitting and she worked in the store. They were both very kind to me.
I later learned that your father was a Holocaust survivor, an unimaginable history, God bless him.
