“ Years ago Kevan decided that he wanted to give back to his HS alma mater and the soccer program that he participated in and loved. And so, he did. Over the last 10 years, Dr. K was a major part of our program. He encouraged all players to increase their fitness and strength training and held an annual dinner for the team at Maggiano's to celebrate. As you can guess, for the 14-18 year old young men on the team, it is always the most highly anticipated event in our season!

Dr. K also spent a lot of time communicating with the players (especially our captains each year) with words of encouragement, kindness, wisdom (most of the time), experience, love, caring, compassion, empathy, and friendship. He taught these young men to lead and care for others, especially the younger members of the team.

He just wanted each of them to love and enjoy the team, their teammates, and their HS soccer experience. And, if we could have some success (which we did) then he would remind them to celebrate and be thankful for each other and their shared experience. He did not have a child on our team, or even in the school at all after 2017-2018. Yet, he gave. He gave his time, money, energy, and friendship to us all and never once asked me for anything in return. This is the beauty of Kevan Kreitman.

In 2018, our soccer team won the state championship. That fall our team was good enough, strong enough, together enough, and lucky enough to win it. It takes skill, strength, teamwork, fortune, and a lot of work from a lot of people. Dr. K was an important piece along with the players, other coaches, and families in winning the championship. I will forever be grateful to Kevan for his contributions to our team in 2018 and all the other years.

Dr. K is a role model for us all. He is the example of selflessness and generosity and someone that we should all aspire to be. Kevan Kreitman is my friend. I miss my friend.

“ I played soccer for Country Day from 2017 to 2021, where I first met and grew to love Dr. K. He was the most remarkable person I've ever had the pleasure of meeting.

Whether it be through his words or actions, Dr. K always had something to give without expecting anything in return. So mature, yet so playfully mischievous at times - I could go on for ages about the selflessness and the altruism he demonstrated. He frequently took time out of his day to send long, encouraging texts or emails to help us laugh, become our best, or generally boost morale — oftentimes all three simultaneously. Dr. K was unbelievably considerate and would often go out of his way to reward us for our hard work, typically with some sort of sweet (M&Ms). I remember once during a particularly humid game at Hillview, I had an awful cramp in my left calf that took me out to the sidelines. Dr. K tended to me, noted that the cramp stemmed from my flat feet, and asked what size shoe I wore. The next time I saw him, he hand-delivered custom foot insoles to help alleviate my cramps. I still wear them to this very day. He once said that when you go out of your way for someone else, it's the gesture that counts, not the item. There are countless other stories just like this.

To me, he was like another father figure in my life. I say that because of how much I grew under his guidance. Dr. K was directly responsible for building my confidence, teaching me only the most important lessons, and how to become a man. But he also held so many different roles during my time at Country Day and beyond. He was a mentor, a coach, a parent, a friend, the shoulder to cry upon whenever we lost a playoff game ... the list goes on and on. I know the DCD soccer program and the players within it held a special place in his heart, but he also held a special place in all of ours with his emphasis on hard work, empathy, and happiness. It's easy to say that it was only high school soccer, but this program is truly something indescribably special. And Dr. K was the one responsible for imprinting the impact of it into my heart forever.

“The soccer program isn't just a part of you when you are players. It remains with you forever. You'll find it very gratifying to know how you positively influenced future teams. Your words, and more importantly, your actions will have a profound and long lasting effect on your teammates. Captains who develop future captains peer to peer is the objective. This will make the program self perpetuating and continually successful.”

Or another time, where he borrowed scooters and casts from his workplace to prank Coach Bossert into thinking that two of our captains had broken their

legs before the season started. There are too many memorable “Remember that time when Kreitman....” moments to count.

Dr. K was an example of what any human being should strive to emulate. He was incredibly wise, witty, and articulate with his words. It seemed that most of whatever he would say, text, or email often had a hidden gem of wisdom within it. Looking back at everything, I found a plethora of advice within all of his words and almost immediately cried upon reading the message he sent to us when our senior season concluded.

“It has been an honor and absolute pleasure being with you the past four years. Knowing you as freshmen and seeing you mature into fine men is priceless for me. I am in your debt and am forever available to you. Thank you once again for memories that will last a lifetime. “

I tried really hard to suppress the tears. He would’ve smiled, pat me on the back, and jokingly told me to toughen up. I often say that if someone were to tell me that Dr. K was an angel, I would’ve believed them without question. And I truly think he was - his heart was one of a kind and irreplaceable.

The price of love is grief. To the Kreitman family, I send my deepest love, prayers, and condolences. We know that he loved you in a way that could never be represented by any physical or verbal means, and we all hurt alongside you.

After the team pitched in and got Dr. K a gift:

“Thank you for the generous gift and kind words. I consider you guys my soccer buddies, on par with my teammates who remain my good friends to this day. I’ll see you all tomorrow.”

To Dr. K, the greatest man I’ve ever had the honor and pleasure of knowing. I’m so grateful I have the privilege of saying you were my friend and someone I looked up to with the most incredible admiration. You said that one day, I’ll realize there is far more happiness in another’s joy than my own, and you lived by that as well as everything else you said to us. I could never express how much I love and miss you. Losing you physically felt like a piece of my heart went missing, but I hope some of it can come back with you living through me. In my senior season, you referenced the story of the Phoenix, saying that sometimes you need to die a little in order to be reborn and rise again as a stronger and wiser version of yourself. I hope you realized that your exceptional life did that for me. I hope to “carry the legacy” that you lived by for the remainder of my life. Thank you for everything, but I think you may have got things a little mixed up. I am instead forever in your debt for what you have done for all of my teammates and I. I’ll think of you every time I see the letter K or touch a weight in the gym. Your impact has changed me and countless others for the better.

As for now, I hope you’re doing well up there. One day we’ll catch up and laugh about old times. I miss you so much.
