Age 94, of Oak Park, died March 26, 2017.

Alex was born in Belgium in 1922 and at the age of 17, wanted to join the Belgium army but his uncle Andre sent him tickets for his family to go to Havana, Cuba to escape Nazi invasion of Belgium. He left for Havana in 1938. He then moved to the United States in 1949 and made Aliya in 1986. An active member of ZOA, JNF, AACI, Congregation Beth Shalom, Masons and the Rotary Club.

He received many honors through the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons including a 50- year recognition award. He also was asked by Rotary International to begin a French speaking lodge in Israel when he moved there in 1986.

Such a gentleman and gentle man. He will always be in my heart and thoughts.

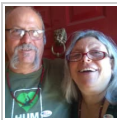
