As you are probably aware, Allan's father worked for Hebrew Memorial, and among his responsibilities, was to pick up the deceased persons, and transport them to the Chapel for funeral/burial preparation. One of the perks was that Mr. Saloman got the use an old Chevy hearse and drove it home every night. On cold winter days, Mr. Saloman drove Allan and his twin brother, Jack, to school in the hearse. My friend Allen was offered a ride to school one cold snowy day, and his mother insisted that he accept. That was the only time, as Allen was very embarrassed, because Allan and Jack laid down in the back of the hearse, and waived to the other cars all the way to school.
