Age 88, of Southfield, died April 18, 2014.

A Russian Pilot during World War II, he helped bomb Berlin. His plane was shot down and after the crash, he was also able to rescue another member of the flight crew. Eventually, he became a president for over 10 years of the Association of Jewish Veterans of World War II from USSR and became one of the founders and an active supporters of the Jewish American and Russian World War II Veteran's Memorial Monument on 10 Mile Road and was in the process of helping fund and create the Russian Veteran Monument which will be erected at the Holocaust Memorial Center in Farmington Hills. Anatoli was also a supporter of the Sinai Hospital in Israel.
