“ Dear Dr. Robert's Family,

I am writing because you are heavy on my heart this morning. We are so sorry to hear about your loss. This must be such a difficult time for you and your Upper Cervical Community of healthcare providers and patients.

We were privileged to know Dr. Andy when my sister, Cailen Wells, worked for him as a new chiropractor in college. It was a blessing to see how much Cailen learned from him as a mentor, and has continued to do so over the past years as she began her own practice in Georgia.

At the time we met Dr. Andy, my son was in fourth grade. He was developing some very concerning health issues that were difficult to treat and understand. Dr. Andy was compassionate and always took his time to try and figure out what might be causing all of Royce's symptoms. Sometimes he would have us come back after hours since we had traveled from Kalamazoo, just so he could care for his needs more thoroughly. After Cailen moved to Georgia, we sought Upper Cervical care a bit closer to home, but Royce continued to suffer with symptoms that continued to get louder and more pronounced. Dr. Andy was one of the first holistic doctors who began working on improving Royce's immune system through his spine. Improving Royce's immune system was a critical turning point in a much later diagnosis of Lyme disease by another Upper Cervical doctor who located in Kalamazoo a few years after our work with Dr. Andy. As of today, Royce graduated from high school this year and Lyme has not been showing up in the work he continues to do with Dr. Ron Warner of Kalamazoo. His healing process took about eight years.

While our family was under Dr. Andy's care, we learned some things that matter most to him. He loved his family. He talked highly about his wife and children. He was excited when they stopped by the office to visit. He was loving and affectionate toward them. They

were first on his priority list. He also cared deeply for his patients. He wanted to help make a change in people's lives. He wanted people to feel better and he taught them about his type of care. He was passionate about his work because he loved helping people and he believed in Upper Cervical Chiropractic. Dr. Andy was also very religious and explained his beliefs as he cared for others. He had priorities and even dark chocolate made the list! My family remembers how he often shared a tray of dark chocolate in the waiting room! He also encouraged us to visit his business neighbor, Great Harvest Bread, for some yummy samples while we waited. Dr. Andy left a legacy of love for his family, his religion, his patients, and his Upper Cervical community. He poured his heart and life into these things that mattered most to him.

We are grateful that Cailen was able to know Dr. Andy and that she was not only able to study under his mentorship, but also work along-side him as a chiropractic partner. He has been an integral part of shaping Cailen into the doctor she is today. 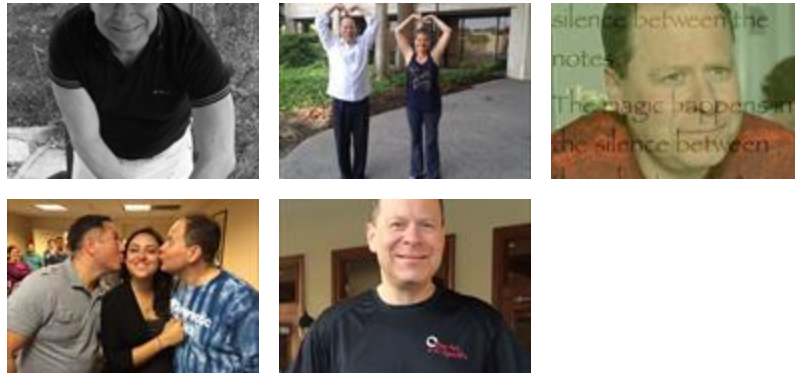
I will honor you by building the office we talked about and by continuing to learn in pursue of mastery. I will always love you, Andy!
