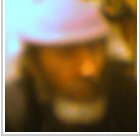

“ I remember my dearest aunt Anita when she was still single, living in the house on Parkside with Bubby and Zada and Freddy. Anita shared her room, which was called the spare bedroom, with little Zada, her grandfather, when he was ill and in bed, a bed so high that they would have to lift Gary and me up to see him. And I remember in that same house Anita feeding me chicken soup when I was in a high chair, coaxing me to eat it, saying "Here's a chicky and here's a chicky".as she held up the spoon with soup and a piece of cooked carrot. I remember once when I threw a temper tantrum at home, she and Gerty were there and lovingly exclaimed, "Red-haired temper!"

At the age of two or three I was the flower girl at Anita and Howard's wedding, and refused to walk down the aisle even when the man with the microphone promised me a great big ice cream cone if I would just walk down the aisle. But that only made me suspicious. My sweet father came and picked me up in his arms. So many years later, and even again a few years ago, Anita laughingly told me that everyone was laughing and looking at me instead of at her, the bride! It brings tears to my eyes right now as I write this. I was so lucky to be surrounded by such love! Bubby Hirsch called her little Anita.

When I had been living in Israel for many years, in 2006 during the war with Lebanon, Ted and I had an Internet Cafe, Ted worked during the week in Jerusalem. One evening I left the shop for half an hour to do an errand, and when I came back, our internet users told me, "Your Aunt Anita called!" That was so good to hear--from our customers in the internet shop at night during the war, that my Aunt Anita called! She always worried about our safety here, as did Mama, of blessed memory, who asked us if we wanted to come home to live with her during the war. These past few years Anita would always ask, are you safe there? And, When are you coming to visit? We saw her last five years ago at Chanuka time. The thought of traveling across the world again gets more and more daunting. And I knew she was surrounded by loving family, though a
