“ To the Entire Gold Family,

I was so saddened to learn of the passing of your dear husband and father, Rabbi Avraham Gold, ZTL. He was such a wonderful person who loved Shoshana (Shoshi) so much. And he was so proud of each of his children, and the beautiful families you each have raised. He loved to tease your mother, but behind this teasing was so much love and admiration. Whenever Ken and I joined them for a Shabbos seudah, he would always joke and thank us for coming so that he could finally eat!!! Then he and Ken would commiserate on how the Shower business would always keep them working, and broke!!!

There are so many stories that so many people will share. I wanted to share one Sheva Brocha Vort that he shared with me over 15 years ago. It was so profound that it has stayed with me all these years. The Vort may be most appropriate to give at a Chanukah Sheva Brocha but the message is applicable for all times.

Why is the Mezuzah to the home at angle, facing inwards to the home, while the Menorah is straight, facing the street?

This is to teach us that when you enter the home, you always want to compromise, you want to be מותר, your spouse, your children, your loved ones. In contrast, the Menorah is straight, facing outward, to teach that when you leave your home there is never any compromising on your Yiddishkeit.

This Vort truly represents how your dear father (and husband) lived his life. And the proof is in the pudding. Look at the beautiful דורות he was blessed to see. To quote Rabbi Jungreis (Rebbetzin Esther Jungreis's husband), "a long life is not good enough, but a good life is long enough". Your beloved husband and father was blessed to have both.

One final thought, ישר כוח to Yaakov, Yitty, Mordechai and Rivky, and each of your children for always being there for your parents

and grandparents, and for all the Friday night visits. It meant the world to him. And to all the Yiddishe nachas he received from every single child, grandchild and greatgrandchild. And to everyone else for all your frequent trips to Detroit.

May all of your beautiful memories give you much comfort.
