Barry Lee Jacobs was born on June 2, 1948, in Detroit, Michigan. He was a lifetime Metro-Detroiter, graduating from Oak Park High School.

He was affectionately known as “The Bear.”

Barry has been known throughout his life as a jokester; a character who lovingly teased his family and friends. In his early 20s, Barry was a ball player and enjoyed playing softball in various city leagues until a back injury sidelined him. He was an avid Detroit sports fan and a season ticket holder to every major and minor league sports team in the Metro area, including the Vipers minor league hockey team. His favorite sport to attend was Tigers baseball and because he attended every single game, he befriended many ushers and concession vendors. He would often take his daughter out of school on Opening Day, a holiday for Barry. He loved taking his son to Lions games. Barry was a true loyalist to Tiger Stadium and the Silverdome, and stopped attending games after the teams relocated.

A career salesman and entrepreneur, he owned Barry’s Shoes For Tots & Teens in Southfield, and Footnotes in West Bloomfield. He also worked in the

children's shoe department at Nordstrom. A dutiful worker, Barry was respected and beloved by his many customers and coworkers. He always had colorful commentary and joke in his pocket. He loved fitting children for their first shoes.

Barry was a skilled painter and always offered his free services to friends and neighbors looking to improve their homes. Barry loved pistachios and could eat an entire bag in one sitting. He was a fan of Chinese buffet and would take his family out every Sunday night to visit his favorite spot in Windsor — Wong's Eatery. Later in life, he enjoyed going to breakfast and dinner at his favorite restaurant Nick's Grecian House.

Barry loved collecting items. He had a closet full of Hawaiian shirts — even those that were not his size! He also had a large collection of bolero and top hats. In his teens, Barry started collecting Sporting News Magazine, a hobby that would follow him throughout his life.

In Barry's later years, he loved to wear colorful suits, hats and ties, and took up dancing. He would engage and entertain all of his friends at his home at Prentice. He enjoyed watching infomercials and buying his friends 3 of everything he bought! He was beloved by staff and residents alike.

Barry is survived by his ex-wife of 42 years, Bonnie Jacobs; daughter Cindy Smith and grandson Jonah; son Steven Jacobs and grandson Matthew. He is preceded in death by his beloved mother, Rachel Jacobs, father Louis "Larry" Jacobs and brother Jeffrey Jacobs.
