Dave will be remembered as a loving family man to his children,  
grandchildren, and great grandchildren. To his children and grandchildren's  
friends he was affectionately known as Uncle Dave or Zeyde. He learned to  
play tennis as a teen, and this became an important part of his life, playing  
into his early 90s. Since childhood he was also an avid stamp collector. Dave  
served in the Army in World War II. He used the GI Bill to earn a degree in  
Electrical Engineering from the University of Michigan. He worked for several

engineering companies and then on his own until retirement. Dave married Ethel Manikerin 1950 and together they were very active in the Labor Zionist Alliance and the Institute for Retired Professionals. They were also involved in Oak Park and Democratic Party politics, and both were Oak Park Commissioners. They loved to travel; they went on 39 trips together through Elderhostel. They were avid square dancers, enlisting other family members to join them. After his beloved Ethel's death, after 58 years of marriage, David moved to All Seasons West Bloomfield, an independent living senior community, where he lived until his death. Until the end he played poker with his All Seasons friends, exercised in front of his computer, read books on his Kindle, and the Detroit Free Press on his iPad. He was very independent until his last couple of days. He will be missed by all who knew and loved him.
