David Wolock was the kindest man I ever knew and the most ethical. He was the descendant of two huge Eastern European families. They were the Wolocks of Vladimeretz (vul-di-mer-etz) and the Freedmans of Berezner. His family consisted of his parents, Edith and Leon Wolock, of blessed memory, his sister, Lillian Elliott, of blessed memory, and his sister Evelyn Cowen. He grew up on Waverly St. in Detroit where he could enjoy many treats from doting aunts in the Dexter-Davidson neighborhood. When David was in the fifth grade, the family moved to Oak Park. He played chess, learned New Math, worked on the Oak Park High School newspaper and began his lifelong devotion to politics. He was 18 when he marched down Woodward Avenue with Martin Luther King, Jr., and heard the preview to King's "I Have a Dream" speech. It was the Young Democrats of Wayne State University and the Young Democrats of the University of Detroit that brought me and David together. David graduated from Wayne State University Law School and escaped the Vietnam War due to his size 14 flat feet. David worked for Wayne County Neighborhood Legal Services in Inkster for several years and then for the Wayne County Prosecutors Office for decades. Thereafter he continued to practice juvenile law and worked with the Sobriety Court and Veterans' Court in Novi, which he found very rewarding. David was also a member of the Governor's Task Force on Juvenile Justice.

Distinguished Law Professor Harold Norris often stated that the job of the prosecuting attorney was to do justice. David believed in doing justice. This was particularly true in

Juvenile Law, where today's abused and neglected child often becomes tomorrow's criminal delinquent.

I became an attorney in 1974, with David's support. Thereafter, three daughters were born, Jana Fried, Rachel Wolock, and Lia Wolock. Jana and her husband, Rabbi Shmuel Fried, are raising five children in Dallas, Texas. They are Pinchas Mordechai, Avraham Yaakov, Rochel Zosia, Leah Mindel Chaya, and Yehuda Lipman. Rachel, an attorney, and her husband, Steven Kish, are the parents of one-year-old Lilia Hadley. Lia Wolock is a doctoral student at the University of Michigan. Her boyfriend is Constantine Ioannou. David delighted in his children and grandchildren. There was absolutely nothing that he would not do for these members of his beloved family.

David is survived by his sister Evelyn Cowen and predeceased by sister Lillian Elliott and brothers-in-law Arthur Cowen and Roy Elliott. He is survived by their descendants Sarah and Moshe Morgenstern, Yitzchak and Tzipka Cowen, Terry Cowen and Leo Fried, Jeremy and Laura Elliott, and Aaron Elliott, as well as many great-grand nephews and nieces.

David was also predeceased by his brother-in-law and sister-in-law, Jerry and Julie Lucas (née Kozielski), whom he greatly admired. He is survived by their descendants, John and Jennifer Lucas, Cindy Lucas, Jennifer and Bill Bryant, Jillian Bryant, Lauren and Kaydence Bryant and Jon Christian, and Zachary, Heather, and Hunter Bryant.

Quite frankly, David's kindness extended beyond his family and friends to the world. He was a member of many organizations designed to "repair the world." He cherished his former classmates, his colleagues, the people that he worked with and his clients, the members of Congregation Beth Shalom and especially those who take part in Shelter Week at Beth Shalom each December.

After many years of political activity, David was well acquainted with many prominent luminaries including Douglas Fraser, the former president of the UAW and his wife, Winifred Fraser, Justice Patricia Boyle, Justice Marilyn Kelly, Governor Jim Blanchard, Governor Jennifer Granholm, and Sam Fishman, the former head of the AFL-CIO.

David was also a wise man. You can make mistakes in politics and in life. However, David guided me, his wife, through four terms in the Blanchard and Granholm administrations. For that and for his love I am eternally grateful.

On January 11, 2016, David was diagnosed with esophageal cancer. On March 23, 2016, he died. Esophageal cancer is a vicious and aggressive disease. With earlier testing and detection, many lives could be saved. Keep this in mind when you visit your gastroenterologist and request an endoscopy.

On a cold January night in 1982, my father Robert Lucas collapsed at home due to a cardiac arrest. They rushed him to Botsford Hospital where they attempted to revive him but were unable to. When we returned home late that night from the hospital, David and Rose had driven from Royal Oak, over treacherous winter roads, to be with us. As they entered our family room, David walked up to me and gave me one of the biggest, best comforting hugs I had ever received. It was what I needed most at that time, and he and Rose were there for our family when we needed them most.

Fast forward to 2008...

I was leaving the office where I worked in Ann Arbor to head home. It was already dark outside and it had begun to snow. As I made a left turn at an intersection near my office, I struck a pedestrian in their leg with my car. The individual was walking into the intersection and I hadn't seen them. Though the accident could have been much worse, it was still a nightmare.

The next morning I contacted my Uncle David because I was still so shaken and didn't know what to do. He was amazing. He calmed me and he helped me go through the events of the accident and advised me what to do. He had nothing but support, comfort and compassion for me. His love for me and understanding of what I was going through was every bit as valuable to me as his advise and wisdom. Once again, he was there for me in one of my darkest times.

I could never say enough good things about David. He was a wonderful uncle, a good friend, an incredibly decent human being and a role model for me. He will be so missed by all of us in our family and always loved.
