



DR. MAX GARBER

Age 91, of Ann Arbor, formerly of Oak Park, died February 20, 2015.

Born in Dundee, Michigan, he served in the Army Air Corps in World War II as a 1st Lieutenant navigator in B-24 Liberator bombers in the European Theater, receiving the Distinguished Flying Cross for valor in aerial combat having flown 35 sorties and also received 3 3leaf clusters. Graduating from the University Of Michigan medical school in 1951, Dr. Garber went on to practice pediatric medicine for over 40 years in Farmington and Canton. With his wife, Shirley (1931-1988) he raised 3 children; Bob, Ken and Marty. He married Roslyn Katz in 1996, and she survives him.

Dr. Garber is lovingly remembered by his family, friends and former patients for his generosity, warmth, humor and compassion. A committed supporter of Israel, he made annual trips there for over two decades. He also was a leader of his congregation, Congregation B'nai Moshe, where he attended services until a few weeks before his death.
