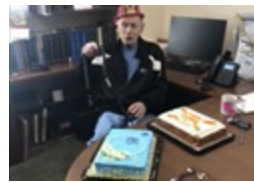

He would speak to my grandmother (Esther Hartman) on an almost daily basis and he and Auntie Phyllis were like an extra set of grandparents.
