“ Although I did not have the privilege of knowing Ed Meer in person, I do know 2 of his several children. I cherish a fond vivid memory of the dedication some 15 years ago, of the Meer Preschool building. It was a much needed facility to house some 10 preschool classes of Yeshiva Beth Yehuda. There were several speakers, but the one that remains with me was Ed Meer. In very few words he told the assembled that the Yeshiva's administration had to twist both of his arms to get him to agree to speak in public. He "merely" (my pun - not his) wanted to explain his motivation in deciding to donate so generously to Torah institutions in our community. The secret was that when his grandchildren came home from their Yeshiva classes, he noticed the difference in their behavior and their attitudes towards life, and he felt personally enriched. He wanted to assure that these educational values would continue to be inculcated into the future.

As the Mishneh in Pirke Avos teaches: "When a person departs from this world, their soul is not accompanied by the wealth that they accumulated during their sojourn in life, but rather by the records of the Torah that they learned and supported, and the good deeds that they performed in life".

Surely the Neshama-soul of Edward Meer is being escorted by an endless transport representative of the Charity that he so freely gave and the Torah learning that he supported. May his bereaved family members be consoled by Hashem amongst the mourners of Zion and Jerusalem
