“ *Many MANY years ago, I was a student at B'nai David Hebrew School and Mr. Goldberg was one of our teachers. Rabbi Donin was the rav of the shul and the school at that time. The school program officially ended after ninth grade with a consecration ceremony, but there was a group of about ten of us who didn't want to stop learning. We took our problem to Rabbi Donin, who was quite taken by this group of teens who wanted to continue learning. He went to Rabbi Goldberg and spoke with him about it. There was no room in the budget to pay for this type of class, but Mr. Goldberg accepted to take us on without pay. We began meeting every week, I think it was on Wednesday nights, and learned in earnest together for the next three years. It was one of the best "shiurim" I have ever had. We used the manuscript from the book that would become "To Be A Jew" by Rabbi Donin and, as well as in depth learning, we also provided Rabbi Donin with constructive criticism as he edited his manuscript. It was a wonderful win/win experience for all.*
