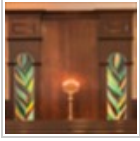

“ First of all, I am learning of his death just today. I deeply regret not having been able to make a shiva call.

I first met Gene and Mindi in the fall of 1964 at Berkeley, where Gene had a position as assistant professor. Back then, there were almost no shomrei Shabbos professors or students on camps. You could count them on one hand, if I recall correctly. So the Schrams provided a kind of home away from home. Mindi was pregnant with their first child. They had me for Shabbos meals from time to time, including when my mother of blessed memory visited. My Mom was so impressed by this gracious and friendly young couple. The Schrams were welcoming of all comers.

I remember that at those meals Gene would be listening very intently to various explanations of Halachah or Gemora that Rabbi Saul Berman was offering. At the time, this was over my head, but the example of the two of them deeply delving into Torah and obviously relishing the chavrusa made a lasting impression. Gene was the professor, but the respect he paid the rabbi, who was younger at that -- that is, the kavod ha-Torah -- also made an impression.

Our paths crossed again years later in Boston -- I don't remember the exact year -- but I believe Gene had a visiting position or fellowship. Then, of course, much later, when we arrived back in Denver I met Yankie and Debbie, and it was a great multigenerational connection.

I remember Gene as a gentle and kind person for whom the Jewish tradition was as natural as breathing. He is beautifully remembered and greatly missed.

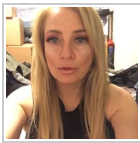
