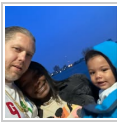

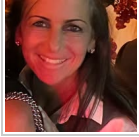

“ We first met as incoming students at college in NYC, both looking for a roommate as we hadn’t been assigned to a room. We spoke for a moment or two and decided we were destined to spend the next nine months together. Little did I know that would be beginning of a 55-yr friendship.

She took me under her wing as her little sister and referred to me as her “shvester” all her life. I have so much to share about Hannah, volumes really, and it’s hard to synopsise.

She had a wonderful Yiddish neshama. She was a true original, kind-hearted, funny, mischievous, caring, a fashionista who designed many of her clothes, loving, deep thinking, beautiful inside and out, and a great friend.

She lived her life as a proud Jew who was involved in her temple and in her community, volunteering and raising money. She was ready to help whenever she was asked, and even when she wasn’t. Being the daughter of Holocaust survivors, she honored and devoted herself to her mother, Toby (& brothers & stepfather), in such a way as to try to ease the pain Toby had suffered during the Shoah. They were quite a twosome! She tried to absorb everything her mother taught her. Toby would have been so proud.

In Robert, she found a partner who brought her joy and fun, adventure, new experiences, devotion, laughter and love. He was so devoted to her, especially in the last six years as he was continuously by her side, and nursing her through her illnesses. She adored him as much as he adored her. They were quite a pair.
