Harriet Garden (née Jonas), beloved wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and friend,

passed away peacefully on July 30, 2025, at the age of 94.

Born in Detroit on October 6, 1930, Harriet was the daughter of Eugene and Gizella Jonas and

the sister of Raymond (Harold) Jonas and Milton Jonas. She met her future husband, Hershel

(Harry) Garden, at the Jewish Community Center in Detroit, and their love story began when he

took her to her senior prom. They married in 1952 and shared a joyful, devoted partnership that

spanned more than six decades.

Together, Harriet and Hershel raised three children — Jeffrey Garden (Helen), Denise Garden

(Garry Turner), and Gail Daien (Michael) — with unwavering love and dedication. Harriet first

worked as an executive assistant at Jam Handy before choosing to stay home

to raise her children, a role she embraced with deep commitment. Later, she and Hershel built a family-run jewelry business at the concourse of Northland Mall, where Harriet's warmth and care became a hallmark of their success.

Harriet was known for her generosity and intelligence. She had a sharp memory, a keen interest in politics and current events, and a deep love for her family. She was a loyal friend, a fabulous cook, and a woman of great compassion who gave selflessly to those she loved — especially in the devoted care she gave her husband in his final years.

Harriet's greatest joy was her family. She was a proud and loving grandmother to Jason Garden (Jocelyn), Bradley Garden (Yitty), Zack Hyman (Carly), Eli Turner, and Danielle Turner, and a cherished great-grandmother to Joseph, Savannah, Noa, Harper and Emma. She was also deeply loved by her many nieces and nephews, who brought her much happiness throughout her life.
