Harry Weberman, of Farmington Hills passed away at age 93 after sunset on December 18, 2015. Harry was born on September 15, 1922 in Detroit, where he grew up. He graduated from Northern High School. He served stateside in the army during World War II. He received a B.A. and M.A. from Wayne State University where he played football and met his future wife Miriam Hollander. He married Miriam on October 31, 1948.

Harry became a teacher at Oak Park High School in the 1950s and then for more than 25 years was a counselor at OPHS, counseling several thousand students and helping them get into the right college or start on the right career path, and also serving as an assistant principal, until retiring in 1985. He was a part time counselor at Saint Mary's Prep in Orchard Lake from 1987-92. He was a warm and sociable person and a much beloved fixture of Detroit's northwest suburban community for almost 60 years.

Harry loved all things Detroit, especially Vernor's and Lafayette Coney Island. He was a proud Democrat, and a member of Congregation B'nai Moshe for more than 55 years.
