“ I couldn’t make it to the service, so I wrote this and Martin Brown read it for me:

I keep thinking of that line from Stand By Me...” I never had any friends later on like the ones I had when I was twelve. Jesus, does anyone?”

I was 11, and Jeremy was 12 when we met in 7th grade Geography class. I was the painfully shy, chubby kid, and Jeremy just started talking to me like I was a normal person. We were best friends immediately. He never lost that quality of being able to draw people out with interesting questions.

We also had Home Ec together, and ruined the Snickerdoodles by forgetting to add Cream of Tartar. We would hang out all the time, as kids do. Weird things would happen to us all the time. Or maybe he just noticed everything that happened and pointed out how weird it all was. We developed our own language, referencing anything that had made an impression: “A good pair of walking shoes;” “This is a tire;” “Chief;” “Milk group”, and too many others to mention. We went to Wrestlemania. Twice. We spent what seemed like endless afternoons going to the mall, or watching MTV, or waiting for my Mom to pick us up from somewhere, always talking about nothing and everything. He made a limited edition comic book series based on us and some of my sister Amy’s friends.

Through high school, I think he was at my house as often as I was. We were in Speech club together, before he concentrated on debate. My first speech was on Zombies, his was Mass Murderers. The summer after freshman year of college, he and I and our friend Gordon spent every night for two months at my house. We played Euchre and watched The Avengers (the TV show with John Steed and Emma Peel) until 3am. We watched Pee-Wee’s Big Adventure incessantly on the VCR, until we could act out the entire movie by heart.

He visited me at college. I saw him get his doctorate. We grew up together. He was part of my family. When we spoke on the phone, it was like we were twelve years old again, every time. Thank you Jer,

for rescuing me from 7th grade, and being my lifelong friend. I'm hoping to see many more weird things with you.
