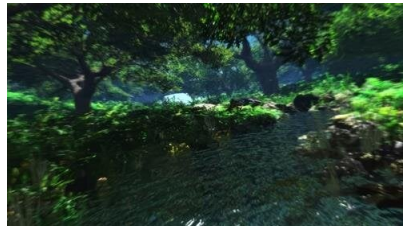

When I was 14 the 9 of us went to Miami Beach for Winter break that continued over New Year's. I remember 2 things from that trip: the hotel allowed teens to attend the adult New Year's Eve Party, but I didn't have a party dress that was appropriate. Uncle Larry told me to go shopping with my Mom, Aunt Rae and Bubbie. He wanted to buy me my first party dress because my Dad would buy me my wedding gown (he did)! I remember that dress as if it were yesterday! An off white dress with a bell skirt and short sleeves! I was delighted! The second memorable event of that trip was not fun. All of us were in the ocean and the current shifted, bringing Portuguese Men-of-War into our area of water. When I got stung on the hand I flew out of the water into Uncle Larry's arms and refused to get down until he carried me to the beach! I remember him laughing until he realized how I was injured. He told me I flew about 12 feet to where he was and he was shocked I moved so fast. Looking back I can see why he laughed. At the time I was terrified and glad he was my "port in the storm".
