“ As many of you know, there have been so many connections with Marc, Susie and her family's group of friends (the Salmon Fressers), and me, before Teshuvah (Jimmy) and now for the past 40 plus years as (Hillel) sharing growth in Yiddishkeit / Torah / and even Israel with Marc, Peggy, and family taking things step-by-step. One Shabbos, I saw Marc at Young Israel. I said "what are you doing here". He said "I'm a member." I said "We're members too. That began our sojourn in Southfield, and simultaneously moved to Oak Park and enrolled our girls in Bais Yaakov. Marc said with all these joint changes that he and his family need to have advanced notice from us if we chose to make Aliyah to Eretz Israel. And following the same path they joined and enjoyed the blessing of living in Hashem's makom (place/home) for his people, the Jews. Though we lived in different communities we kept in touch, visited frequently sharing in the blessing of living "at home", our home. Even thought we certainly supported their return to Michigan - in fact Susie suggested that they buy the house across from our Oak Park House, a very holy house where Rabbi David Rabinowitz and Lieba dwell (he was the first deaf person to get smicha). Never have we met and absorbed the holiness of Rabbi Rabinowitz and how pleased that Marc and Peggy bought and moved into that holy domicile. So much to say, to share about our connected life's events, happy moments, sad moments, but nevertheless always moments of mutual respect, devotion, and love. More stories to come. May Hashem bring comfort to Peggy and their lovely family. Marc's neshama certainly is telling stories and showing pictures of so many wonderful, grateful life's experiences. We love you Marc.
