A Holocaust Survivor, Martin came to the United States in 1947. He married his beloved Sue in 1951 and then began his career in 1953 when he opened his first bakery on Chene Street in Detroit. He continued to open an additional 5 locations of MODERN BAKERY with a total of 6 locations. Mr. Weiss was an active member and supporter Congregation B'nai Moshe, its Men's Club, Einstein Lodge of B'nai B'rith, American Mogan Dovid Adom, the Jewish Community Center and the West Bloomfield Holocaust Memorial Center.

Loving son of the late Libby and the late Abraham Psache Weiss.
