“G-d should comfort you among all the mourners for Tzion and Yerushalim.

I worked for four years for Mr. Dunn while he lived on Raine and the business was on Schoolcraft and Inkster. I did everything from tax returns to washing windows, from computerizing the office to teach him how to recite the blessing on the Torah for his grandson's bar mitzva.

My Mother invested money with him. That investment appreciated, and ultimately paid for my wedding. Unfortunately I lost contact with him. I saw him once at a wedding my neighbor Ervin Edelstein made. However, we could not talk long because the music was too loud.

I was at the funeral in May for Mrs. Dunn. Mr. Dunn did not recognize me (understandably since back then I had a beard), He indicated I should come over since he saw a strange face. Later on while I was shoveling he called me over again and we had another talk. At 5:00 I got in the car to go to his house, but it started to rain so I didn't go.

My paternal grandparents died three weeks apart from each other. Their tombstones were erected just before my Parents and sister left communist Romania. The tombstones shared a common base. On it was inscribed what King David said upon learning of the death of King Saul and Prince Jonathan. The words were "Who were beloved and pleasant in their lifetimes and in their death were not separated." That verse is recited in the Shabbos liturgy as well as in the Yizkor Memorial Service.

The Dunns loved their lives together, and in death were not separated. Their memories should be a blessing.
