The second to last born of seven children, my mother's youngest sister registers with me the familiarity family idealistically is meant to be.

An example of her unassuming and understated kindness has lasted in my memory from when I was six or seven years old, and she wasn't much more than a teenager.

It was on an evening my parents were out, and I had twisted my ankle causing a sprain to begin throbbing. It hurt and I was in need of comforting.

Young Aunt Rita was the adult presence looking out for me.

I was in pain extreme enough to tempt me to tears. Aunt Rita's comforting in a fashion not to be taken for granted eased me through the couple hours it took to drift off to sleep.

Her softly spoken kind compassion was flavored with touches of humor that had me giggling amid cringes of pain.

Her lack of frustration with not a hint of impatience made such an indelible impression on me that I'm recalling it now as if it were a fresh memory, seventy years later.

After the several years gone by since Aunt Rita's passing, this entry may well be left unread. Nonetheless, I'm feeling the relief of having written for my own satisfaction of praise well earned.

And this: Yes, her matzah ball soup was outstanding; and so was her fried matzah!

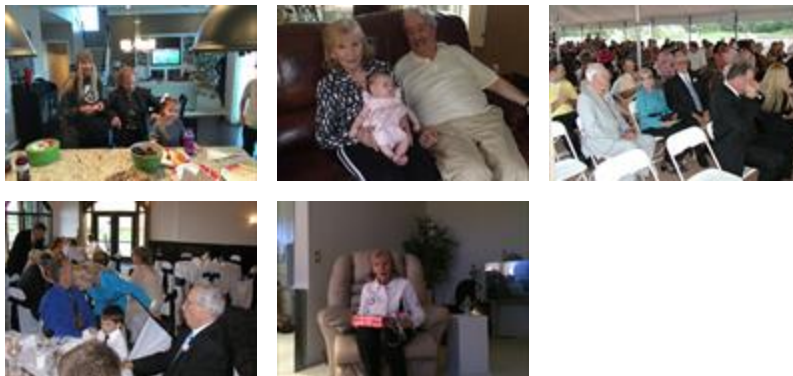
