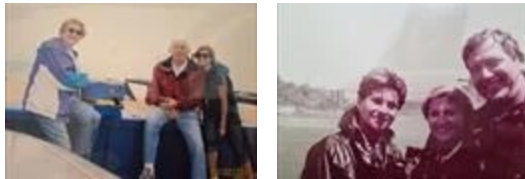

I still can get my napkins in a perfect fan because of the trick Aunt Ruth taught me, and I was also going to mention the doilies but everyone else already beat me to the punch. In fact, I never saw a doily in my life unless Aunt Ruth was in town and making the most gorgeous trays of cookies and sweets. During her last visit to Toronto about 5 years ago, even though she was in the early stages of dementia, she was so engaged in conversation with my daughter, Maia. She always had a way of making you feel so seen during conversations, she had a true gift.

One more thing I wanted to share. My daughter Maia loves to write. Last year, Maia did a project on how children and their relationship to “play” and games during the Holocaust. She became fascinated with Ruth’s story, she researched Ruth online, reading all about her and listening to her interviews. She’s currently writing a fictional story based on Ruth’s life (although she tells me it’s a work in progress).

“Ruth changed her destiny and turned it into a legacy.

Ruth’s legacy goes far beyond her survival. She was a builder—of family, community, of bridges connecting generations. She taught us that no matter how broken the world may seem, it is our responsibility to rebuild it, piece by piece, with kindness and compassion.

About 10 year ago, around June 2014, with Sue’s help, Ruth connected with the Muszkies from Brazil; it immediately turned into a very strong bond. This did not happen by chance, it was not only because we are part of the same family, neither because she was a survivor seeking the lost family puzzle. It was Ruth’s empathy, sweetness, softness and unique capacity of to spread love with her magic smile. There are no words to express our feeling of connectedness.

Our Lea was born 2 months later in Pittsburgh, and she didn’t hesitate to come visit with Mark, Shelly, and Leah. It was a unique moment when Ruth met Sonia, her first cousin.

After that, there were many other occasions where we met again, including the Thanksgivings in Detroit, the trip to Poland and the family trip to Brazil We feel so thankful for “becoming again” part of this family. We felt close and intimate as if we had lived together our whole lives, despite being far apart. But it was the relationship between her and Lea that surprised us. The feeling between them became something strong, beautiful that words are not enough to describe. After all, there are 2 generations difference in time and despite that, the bonds are even stronger. This is incredible and magical, something that only a person with such special gifts could build.

We had very emotional moments together in Poland, on the launch of Ruth’s father book. On those 6 days, we had such an intense experience. Visiting with her the orphanage where she stayed after

the war, and hearing her memories is something we will never forget.

Another cherished time we hold close in our hearts was when Ruth and her family came to Brazil. That time together was filled with joy, warmth, and connection. It remains etched in our hearts. We were deeply touched by the love and generosity she brought with her, and by the sense of unity and belonging that she nurtured among us. We met with many Ostrowiec families descendants where everyone was delighted listening to her.

Ruth had an extraordinary ability to bring people together. Her warmth, her stories, and her faith in humanity reminded us of the importance of unity. She taught us that even in the face of profound loss, there is hope, there is love, and there is possibility to create something beauty from the ashes. Her big magical smile illuminates paths.

Her kindness was not in form of grand speeches but simple acts—listening, caring, and always remembering the value of each individual.

It is upon us to now carry her legacy. Let us honor her memory by embracing kindness, connectedness, family values and ensuring that her example lives in our actions and our hearts. We are extremely thankful for all kindness, teaching and love she gave us.

May her memory be a blessing.

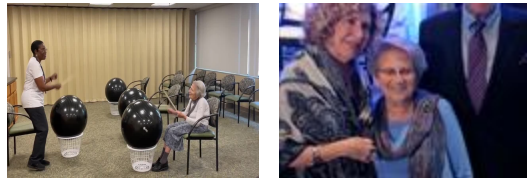

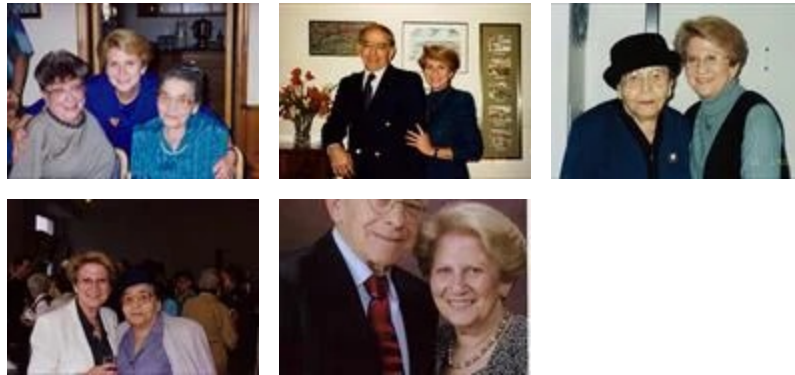
