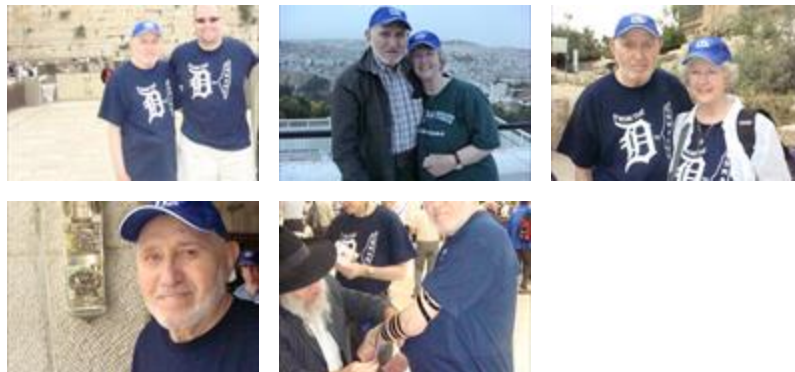

“ *The world lost a great man today. I am so grateful that I got to know Sam Boocker 12 years ago. Sam and his lovely wife, Joan, joined a trip to Israel that I led in May 2010. They had never been to Israel before and didn't want to put off their dream any longer. Sam was 83-years-old at the time and so I encouraged him to have a 2nd Bar Mitzvah (70+13) while we were touring a synagogue in ancient Tzfat. It was truly the highlight of the trip. Sam and I also planted a tree together, wrapped tefillin at the Kotel (Western Wall), and studied together on the Shavuot holiday in Jerusalem. I never had a chance to be in Israel with my own grandparents and so this was the closest I got. I might have been the rabbi on this Israel trip, but the Boockers were always looking out for me -- making sure that I was drinking enough water on a hike, and that I called Elissa to check in each day back home. May the memory of Sam Boocker be only for blessings to his entire family and to everyone who was honored to know him.*
