Relatives, friends, acquaintances, etc. To the best of my knowledge, he and my sister began seeing one another in high school and married thereafter. He and his family were courteous enough to let me into their home after my dad died. I remember him speeding and zig zagging through the streets as he drove me home. I remember him driving me home from work in what turned out to be a 10 inch snowstorm in Jan. 1994 with the radio talking about the dawning of the Harding-Kerrigan scandal at Joe Louis Arena. I remember him showing up at Pepper elementary school when I was playing football with my friends and kicking the ball what appeared to be sky high to a 10 year old. Going to a Detroit Drive game when the city had an Arena Football League team. In an ideal world, everybody would live into their 80's and 90's and fulfill their obligations and aspirations, but we have to deal with the fact that it's not and react accordingly. One can say stuff like "he's in a better place", etc. in an attempt to console themselves and others, but, suffice to say, we want them here with us as long as possible, though we know it's inevitable that one day, all we'll have are the memories they've provided us. Bye Scott. I hope wherever you go and whatever form you assume next, you'll brighten as many lives as you did when you were here with us.
