“ I'm so sorry to hear this! From Facebook I saw that Sheilah had a very bad stroke in October of 2015, but was hoping that her situation would improve. I had hoped to see her in September of 2014 when I was passing through Detroit with my identical twin brother after we attended our 55th high school reunion in Minneapolis, it didn't work out. I was married to her sister Joan who died at the end of 1999. Sheilah was always kind to me the couple of times we met in the years after Joan's passing. After my trip with my brother in 2014 his health began to weaken and in November of 2016 they found inoperable cancer. He died in an excellent hospice facility in Calgary, Alberta nine days before Sheilah died. Fortunately I was able to be with him for his last three weeks of life.
