“Where do I begin...I cannot think of a bigger influence in my life, of the man I became, the husband, the father to 4 kids, all influenced by Sol and Ike. Sol was a second father to me, I remember riding my bike to go to work at the gas station, about a 5 mile ride at age 13 or 14. I worked for them at the Marathon, Gulf and Sunoco over almost a 10 year period at a most influential time in my life, my teens and early 20's. It was learning about life, and we had fun doing it. Sol taught me about people, life, work ethic, honesty, diligence, determination, and how to make a path to succeed in the game of life and be a good person along the way. A few years ago I was in a seminar with a group of other airline pilots and they asked each of us to identify and discuss who was their mentor, who had the most influence on who we became and why. While it was interesting to hear all these military pilots talk about their previous instructors, or Generals, or teachers at the Naval, or Air Force Academy, My mentor that I spoke of was Sol, an immigrant from Romania, gas station owner, who had taught me many of the same personality traits for success that my peers had from the United States Service Academies and that I had learned from Sol to compete with them in my profession.

These traits also go through me to my kids, I have found over the years, when I was still raising them, the same "Sol'isms' ", coming out from me and teaching them also. That was the point of that work seminar and in discussing the biggest influence on your life, it was to highlight the power of one, like ripples from a rock thrown into a lake and the ripple effect being how one person can have an influence on many. In my life it was Sol, through me to my kids and now that they are having kids, I am sure, and will most likely see "Sol'isms' "living on in their parenting to another whole generation, as well as through me to my grandchildren now.
