She could hear all of my loud responses to Kaddish, Kedushah, etc. Had she found fault with my pronunciations, no doubt she would have had a kind and gentle way of letting me know. Fortunately that was not the case. It was a special pleasure to be able to wish her a "Good Shabbos ", because her reply was always with warmth. There was a noticeable lack in the shul during the past 9 months of that she was living with her family in Chicago. And now we will never be able to bring back what was lacking 😞.

Those of us in our local community who failed to reach out, to let her know how much she was missed, need to ask her Neshama for Mechilla for not letting her know how deeply her absence was felt. But as most of the speakers noted in their eulogy remarks, Mrs. Levitin's impact on this community that she loved so much, will continue to manifest itself for generations to come.
